About the Programme

In the 5-week Hope-Action Theory (HAT) Certificate Programme, join Dr. Norm Amundson, Andrea Fruhling, and guest instructor Dr. Spencer Niles in learning new approaches to working with clients in order to effectively increase hopefulness in practical and engaging ways.

Grounded in the Hope-Action Theory research, learn more about how Hope-Action can be applied to career development. Learn to apply the Hope Action Inventory and a range of creative interventions when working with clients, and engage with your community of professional career practitioners through synchronous and asynchronous learning opportunities.

Participants will attend live cohort training sessions via online platform, participate in small learning groups as well as connecting online with fellow participants to engage in conversation to share and support further learning.

At the end of the programme, participants will be able to:

- Promote career resilience through the Hope-Action practice
- Apply HAT career activities to facilitate career exploration
- Customise HAT career interventions to navigate career exploration and planning through the Active-Engagement Model

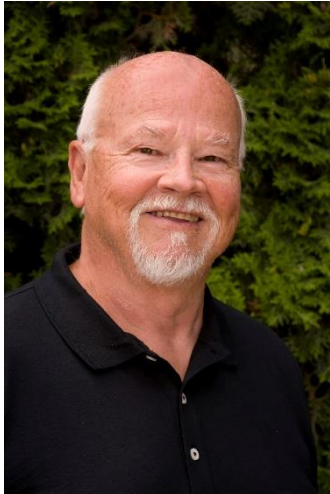

He has a PhD from the University of Alberta and also holds an Honorary Doctorate from the University of Umea, Sweden. He has worked in the career development field for over 40 years. During this time he has published many books and articles, including a 2018 Anniversary Edition of his nationally award winning book "Active Engagement". Most recently he has co-authored the books, "Career Flow & Development: Hope in Action" and "Career Recovery: Creating Hopeful Careers in Difficult Times". Many of his books and workbooks have been translated into other languages (Japanese, Korean, Danish, Swedish, Finnish, French, Latvian, Estonian, Romanian, Icelandic, Arabic, Hungarian, Polish, Greek, Dutch).

In his work he emphasizes the importance of creativity, imagination, storytelling, dynamic action, metaphors and hope. Dr. Amundson has presented his work at many national and international conferences (in more than 30 countries). Dr. Spencer Niles is a Professor in the Counselor Education Program at William & Mary (having previously served as Dean and Professor). He was also a Distinguished Professor and Department Head at the Pennsylvania State University, and Professor of Counselor Education at the University of Virginia. He is a Past-President of Chi Sigma Iota International and was twice the President of the National Career Development Association (NCDA). He is the recipient of the NCDA Eminent Career Award, and has been recognized with numerous awards from the American Counseling Association (ACA). He has authored and co-authored approximately 140 publications, and his book *Career Development Interventions* (6th edition) is currently the best-selling career text in the world. His forthcoming co-authored books are titled *Career Flow and Development: Hope-Action Theory*, and *Career Recovery: Creating Careers with Hope in Difficult Times*.

Dr. Niles is a Fellow of both the NCDA and ACA and an honorary member of several national and international career development associations. He has spoken at numerous conferences around the world, and taught in over 27 countries. He currently serves as a member of the Board of Directors for the International Center for Career Development and Public Policy.
